Volunteer

- Feed My Starving Children volunteers *save lives* by hand packing meals for malnourished children! Each meal has all of the nutrients a starving child needs in a day and costs just **15 cents** to produce.
- Each volunteer packs an average of **\$35** worth of food—more than a box of meals—in a 2-hour session! That will feed a child for 8 months!
- In 2006, volunteers packed **30 million meals** to feed starving children in more than 45 countries!
- **SMM volunteer shifts are Thursday, May 3 from 8:00 PM—9:30 PM and Friday, July 27 from 8:00—9:30 PM at the end of 30-hour famine. Please be on time!**

Give

- Time and Energy: Pack meals for a 1.5-hour shift at our facility at 1071 National Parkway, Schaumburg, IL (see directions on the back.) **Your parents and or sponsors are encouraged to stay and help work also.**
- Donations: Consider purchasing a box of food for \$35. *Any* donation will make a big difference to a starving child. At 15 cents per meal, we need to raise **\$6 million** for this year's expenses.

- Feed My Starving Children is a Christian, nonprofit organization; pray for God's blessing of our new packing site in Schaumburg, IL which just opened in December of 2007
- Pray for FMSC and starving children around the world.

Again this year a tiered discount will be available for families with more than one child in our programs.

First Child \$160.00
Two Children. \$270.00
Three or more Children \$375.00 maximum

There are also three other programs that are being offered

- Each family can get a one time \$10 rebate if tuition fees are paid in full on or before **June 30, 2012**.
- We are encouraging families this year to take advantage of an equal monthly payment plan. On the back of this letter is a form to fill out having the same amount charged to a credit card or debit card for five months from July 1st to November 1st. One child would be equal to five payments of \$32.00. Two children would be equal to five payments of \$54.00. Three or more children would be equal to six payments of \$75.00.
- Tuition fees are waived for students of parents that volunteer to be a full year catechist in either of the RE programs or the Faith Group programs.

We hope that one of these will help accommodate sending your youth. Please also know that we would be glad to talk with you personally to discuss other financial hardships. Inability to pay is never an excuse not to enroll your youth.

7. Weapons and/or drug paraphernalia are not allowed.
8. If under the age of 18, prescription drugs need to be given to an adult for storage and distribution.
9. Infraction of these rules can mean immediate dismissal with no refund. Participants will be responsible to local authorities as well.

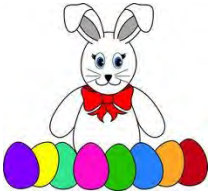
